SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION No. 1.

By AS THE FIRST SESSION.

Passed and held at the City of Washington on Monday,

the nineteenth day of May, One Thousand Nine Hundred and

Nineteen.
A JOINT RESOLUTION ratifying a proposed

amendment to the Constitution of the United States,

providing that "The right of citizens of the United

States to vote, shall not be denied or abridged by

the United States or by any State on account of sex,
and providing further that Congress shall have power

to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

of the United States of America in Congress assembled

(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That

WHEREAS, both houses of the Sixty Sixth
Congress of the United States of America, at its First
session, by a constitutional majority of two-thirds
thereof, passed a resolution submitting to the several
States a proposition to amend the Constitution of the
United States, a certified copy of which has been
received by the Governor of the State of Tennessee,
from the Secretary of State of the United States, as
required by law, and by him transmitted to this Gen-
eral Assembly, the same being in the following words,
to-wit:

J O I N T R E S O L U T I O N

Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution extending the
right of suffrage to women.

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
of the United States of America in Congress assembled
(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That
the following article is proposed as an amendment to the
Constitution, which shall be valid to all intents and
purposes as a part of the Constitution when ratified by
the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States.

Article _____

"The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex.

"Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation ."
